Foellinger awards more than \$2.5 million for local youth

The Foellinger Foundation has approved grants totaling \$2,551,552 to enrich the lives of young people in Allen County.

“The services funded by the Foellinger Foundation will affect hundreds of young people,” said Cheryl Taylor, President.

“Many of the programs and services funded by these grants will provide operating support, funding which will maintain their day-to-day operations. The Foellinger Foundation believes that investing in mission-driven, well-managed, results-oriented organizations will help more people move from dependence to independence.”

The grants fall in the Early Childhood Development and Youth Development categories, which reflect the Foundation’s focus on children and their families, especially those with the greatest need and least economic opportunity.
